OHSLA Ejection Report

The OHSLA needs to be informed of every high school lacrosse player or coach ejection. This form is to be filled out by the referees officiating the game and submitted via e-mail to the Assistant Commissioner (pattibaumann@comcast.net) AND the Chief Official (laxrefzee@aol.com) immediately following the game. Do NOT wait until the next day to fill out this form. Each referee shall submit a report independent of the other referee.

This form is to be used by the OHSLA and member schools to provide details concerning an ejection.

The NFHS specifies ejectionable actions as: Accruing 2 non-releasable, unsportsmanlike conduct penalties as prescribed in 2006 NFHS Boys Lacrosse rule book, page 37, Rule 5-9, Article 1, a, b, & c. These include: A) entering into an argument with an official or attempting to influence the official's decision, B) using threatening, profane or obscene language or gestures, or C) baiting, taunting, or calling undue attention to oneself, or any other act considered unsportsmanlike by the officials. Rule 5-11, page 38, Article 1, a, b, c, or d results in an immediate ejection by the player or coach. These actions include: A) deliberately striking, or attempting to strike anyone or leaving the bench area during an altercation; B) using tobacco or smokeless tobacco; C) Receiving a second non-releasable unsportsmanlike foul (Rule 5-9, Article 1, d, e, & f are releasable fouls); D) any action deemed by the officials to be flagrant misconduct. When the official issues an ejection penalty, the in-home shall serve a 3-minute non-releasable penalty in place of the ejected player or coach. The player who has been ejected must leave the field but may remain at the bench as long as his behavior does not further interfere with the play of the game. Coaches who are ejected must leave the field and must be out of "sight and sound" of the field.

Rules 20, 21 and 23 in the 2005-2006 OSAA Handbook address player and coach suspension penalties as a result of being served an ejection penalty.
